

Rites held for Harmon Cooper

Harmon L. Cooper, 75, of Kellogg died Sunday afternoon at Colonial Manor Nursing Home in Baxter. *Nov. 15*

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday afternoon at the Reese Chapel, with the Rev. Ann Estill of the Kellogg United Methodist Church officiating. Burial was at Our Silent City Cemetery, Kellogg.

The son of Alvin and Martha Slagle Cooper, he was born on June 9, 1906, at Monticello, Ky. As a boy, he moved to the Kellogg area with his family. He was married to Iola Bleakney on Aug. 28, 1926, at Newton.

Mr. Cooper farmed until moving into Kellogg in 1953, then worked for the city. He was a charter member of the Glendale Grange and a past member of the Kellogg Lions Club.
