James Alexander Cooper, the son of James and Barbara Anderson Cooper, was born on Jan. 24, 1875, on a farm in Pleasant Township, north of Ewart, where he grew to manhood.

On Dec. 25, 1899, he married Rosa Andrews. To this union two sons were born. Most of their married life was spent in the Montezuma community except for 12 years spent on a farm near Saskatchewan, Fillmore, Canada. Mrs. Cooper died Dec. 28, 1960.

Early in life he joined the Methodist Church at Ewart. After returning from Canada

he transferred his membership to the Christian Church
