

Sister of Milo Morgan Dies at Deep River

Ida Morgan, youngest daughter of John and Ellen Morgan, was born in Lee county, Illinois, May 26, 1853. Departed this life July 27, 1924, aged 71 years, 2 months and 1 day.

When two years of age she came with her parents to Iowa and located in Poweshiek county on the farm where Brown Cranston now resides. Here she grew to womanhood and on January 30, 1873, she was united in marriage with R. B. Cranston. Three children came to their home, two boys and a girl, all of whom survive her.

Aunt Ida as she was known, was a member of Deep River Methodist Episcopal church. For one who lived in the country she was often in church. She enjoyed all the services, especially the Sunday School. She was ever thoughtful of her pastor, many times sending remembrances of farm delicacies and little messages of thoughtfulness.

She was always ready to do her part with the ladies of the church in their societies among whom she will be greatly missed. She leaves to mourn a devoted husband, two sons, Clint and Cloyd, one daughter, Mrs. Myrtle Putnam, all of Deep River.

Besides these are nine grandchildren and one great grand child, one brother Milo Morgan of Grinnell, two sisters, Mrs. Angeline Forney of Lyons, Kansas, and Mrs. Margaret Atherton of Deep River and many other relatives and a host of friends.

Funeral services were held at the residence on Tuesday afternoon at 1 P. M., Rev. Lloyd Tennant preaching, the music was by W. C. Ocheltree and wife, with Mrs. Riddehl at the piano. Interment in Golden Rod Cemetery.—Montezuma Republican.
