J.C. Cranston Rites Conducted July 11

Funeral services for James Cloyd Cranston were held at the Deep River Presbyterian Church at 2 p.m. Thursday, July 11, with the Rev. Edward Jeamsby officiating. Music was provided by Mrs. Doren Dale and Mrs. George Dale.

Interment was at Golden Rod Cemetery, Deep River.

Mr. Cranston, 90, passed away Monday, July 8.

The son of Borton and Ida Morgan Cranston, he was born on a farm southeast of Deep River on Nov. 21, 1877. In his youth he attended a rural school.

On March 9, 1907, he was united in marriage with Lydia Ann Doonan. To this union five children were born. In 1926, he and his sons joined the First Presbyterian Church of

Deep River. The Rev. E. T. Jamsby was pastor at that time.

The Cranstons lived on a farm south of Deep River until they retired in 1939 and moved into Deep River. In 1957 they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary.

Mr. Cranston was preceded in death by an infant son, James; a daughter, Bonnibel Burns; and his wife Lydia.

On Nov. 12, 1961, he was united in marriage with Kathryn Mac Fadden. They resided in Deep River and Pasadena Calif.

J. C. Cranston, 90, Father of Prominent Family, Laid to Rest Here July 11
