Mr. Craven was a long-time member of the Masonic Lodge and was a lifetime member of the National Education Association and the Iowa State Education Association. He was

He was a teacher, athletic coach and principal at Seymour for 7½ years and served as superintendent of schools in Lineville, Lovilla, Garwin, Laurel, Mystic and Sully.
