## Funeral of Mrs. Laura Creamer Is Held Friday

Funeral services for Mrs. Laura Creamer, who passed away Feb. 17 in Los Angeles, were held Friday afternoon from the Baptist church, conducted by Rev. William Welsh. Burial was in Hazelwood cemetery. Mrs. Laura Creamer, aged 63, was born near and educated at Bishop Hill, Ill., where she grew to womanhood. She later moved to Iowa, where she was married to Ernest Mintle March 15, 1891.

To this union were born five children: H. R. Mintle of Arispe, Ia.; Thomas L. Mintle, who preceded her in death and resided in Grinnell; Earl L. Mintle of Grinnell; Mrs. Hazel Seeberger of Los Angeles, Calif., and L. D. Mintle of Chicago, Ill. The family lived northeast of Grinnell until 1910, when they moved to Grinnell.

Upon her husband's death in 1916, she later was married to J. C. Creamer of Grinnell, where they lived for a short time, then moved to Gilman, Ia., where later Mr. Creamer died. Since then Mrs. Creamer lived in Grinnell and later went to live with her daughter in Los Angeles, where she passed away after a very brief illness, Feb. 17, 1935.

She was a member of the Baptist church here at Grinnell and her friendship and love will be a cherished memory for the many ones who knew her.

She is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Maude Bergland of Galva, Ill., and Mrs. Cassie Olson of Ke-wanee, Ill.
