Duane Crossley, 39, Grinnell College music faculty member, was fatally injured in a Friday morning crash about a mile west of Stuart on Highway 6.

Taken to a hospital at Greenfield, Crossley succumbed some two hours after the highway accident.

Alone In Car

On his way to see California friends visiting in southwest Iowa, Crossley was alone in his car when it collided with a car driven by Robert M. Stone, 30, of Des Moines.

Stone, who is press representative in the Iowa-Nebraska area for M-G-M pictures, suffered minor injuries in the acci-
