MISS HELEN DALBEY

Miss Helen Dalbey, 96 of Fort Dodge, formerly of Brooklyn, died Tuesday, Oct. 18, 1988, in Trinity Regional Hospital, Fort Dodge, Ia.

Graveside services for Miss Dalbey were held at 2 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 22, in the Brooklyn Cemetery, Brooklyn. Rev. Kalen K. Fristad, pastor of the Grace United Methodist Church of Brooklyn, officiated. The Nevenhoven Funeral Home of Brooklyn was in charge of arrangements.

Helen Celia Dalbey, daughter of William Henry Dalbey and Mary Giauque Dalbey, was born July 23, 1892, in Brooklyn, Ia.

Miss Dalbey graduated from the Brooklyn High School. She taught five years in rural schools of Brooklyn. She then went to Training School State Teachers College, Cedar Falls, from 1916 to 1917 and from 1918 to 1919. She taught in schools in Sioux City from 1919 to 1957, a period of 38 years. From 1957 to 1967 she did substitute teaching. In 1967 she moved to Des Moines where she lived with her sister Blanche. In March of 1987 they moved to the Marian Home in Fort Dodge.

Miss Dalbey was a member of the Methodist faith.

Surviving are her sister, Blanche Dalbey, in the Marian Home in Fort Dodge, and three nephews, Keith Berckhan of Brooklyn, Ronald Berckhan of Fort Dodge, and Delmar Berckhan of Devils Lake, N. D.

Mrs. Dalbey was preceded in death by her parents, her sister, Zillah Berckhan, and her brother, Earl.
