

Anna Davis⁵ Rites Held ²⁸/₇₂

(DWIGHT)

A former Grinnell resident, Anna Davis, 88, of 809 Center Point Rd. N.E., Cedar Rapids, widow of Dwight Davis, died Sunday morning after a prolonged illness.

She was born in Germany June 29, 1883, and came to the United States in 1893, residing in Grinnell until 1924 when she moved to Cedar Rapids.

Mrs. Davis served for seven years as a police matron with the Cedar Rapids Police Department. She was a member of Knox United Presbyterian Church, past Nobel Grand of the Home Rebekah Lodge, and a member of the Golden Age group.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Ruby McGinty, four sons, Will C., Clyde Jay, Frank Dwight, and Murphy (Pat) Davis, all of Cedar Rapids; eight grandchildren; 18 great-grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Ralph Rutledge of Sharpsburg, Iowa, and Miss Elizabeth Kaisand of Cedar Rapids; and two brothers, Charles J. Kaisand of Grinnell and Jacob Kaisand of Gonzales, Tex.

Memorial services for Mrs. Davis were held at 1 p.m. Wednesday at the Kuba Funeral Home East, with the Rev. Floyd J. Conroy, pastor of the Knox United Presbyterian Church, officiating.

Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery here.
