DWIGHT DAVIS' REMAINS BURIED IN HAZELWOOD

Former Grinnell Boy, Who Died at Council Bluffs, Brought Home for Burial.

The remains of Dwight E. Davis, whose sudden death at Council Bluffs on Tuesday of brain fever came as a shock to both family and friends, were brought here Wednesday and interred in Hazelwood cemetery. Services, in charge of Professor S. J. Buck, were held at the home of his parents. Mr. and Mrs. H. I. Devis, in east Grinnell, on Wednesday afternoon.

Mr. Davis was born in Sheridan township, July 22, 1868, and moved with his parents to Grinnell when a boy. He graduated from Grinnell high school in 1888 and was at one time a student in Iowa College. He also took a business college course at Des Moines and was for a time employed in the National Bank of Rippey, in this state.

He was also engaged as a stationary engineer in an elevator at Rippey and seven years ago went to Omaha, where he was engaged in the same kind of work. While at work Saturday he was stricken suddenly with brain fever and taken to the Council Bluffs hospital, where he died Monday. The remains were brought home by his father and brother-in-law, V. G. Preston. The news of his death will be received with sorrow by the many our friends who remember him well and with whom he was very popular.
