## Kelley Davis, 73, Former County Assessor, Dies

LYNNVILLE (Special)—Kelley Davis, 73, of Montezuma, former Poweshiek county assessor, died Friday, Nov. 5th, at a Cedar Rapids hospital following a brief ill-

Funeral services were held today (Monday) from the Steffy Funeral Home at Montezuma. Interment was in the Friends cemetery at Lynnville.

He was the son of John R. and Eliza Jane Lancaster Davis and was born at Lynnville on Mar. 10th, 1892. He received his elementary education in the Searsboro schools and graduated from Penn College at Oskaloosa in 1917.

On Apr. 18th, 1918, he was united in marriage with Jessie Ratcliff. They were the parents of two sons, Richard of Searsboro and Keith of Malcom.

For a number of years he was engaged in farming and in 1933 was employed with the regional AAA office at Brooklyn. From 1947 until 1958, he served as Poweshiek county assessor.

Following his retirement, he received state recognition for 15 years of service to various agricultural programs.

Surviving are his wife and two sons; two brothers, Jack Davis of Clinton and Howard Davis of Searsboro; and five grandchildren.

Kelley Davis, son of John R. and Eliza Jane Lancaster Davis was born in Lynnville, Iowa, on March 10, 1892 and departed this life on November 5, 1965 in Mercy hospital in Cedar Rapids after a brief illness at the age of 73.
