Newell Davis dies in Omaha

The Rev. Newell E. Davis, 52, former pastor of the Grinnell United Church of Christ-Congregational, died Sunday evening at his home in Omaha, Neb Oct. 22

A memorial service was conducted at First-Central Congregational United Church of Christ in Omaha at 4 p.m. Wednesday.

Memorials in the Rev. Mr. Davis's name may be sent to the First-Central Church in Omaha or to the United Church of Christ-Congregational, Grinnell.

A native of Vandalia, Ill., he was born July 7, 1926. He was a graduate of the University of Illinois and received his divinity degree from Vanderbilt University Divinity School in 1952. He did further study at the University of Chicago Divinity School and at Union Theological Seminary in New York City.

Ordained by the Tennessee Conference of the Methodist Church in 1952, the Rev. Mr. Davis served a pastorate in Williamstown, Mass., and served as director of the Wesley Foundation at Urbana, Ill., before transferring to the United Church of Christ in 1963.

He was minister of education in the Congregational Church at Winnetka, Ill., from 1963 to 1965. In September 1965, he became pastor of the Grinnell church, serving here until January 1974 when he moved to a pastorate in Longmont, Colo.

The Rev. Mr. Davis was called to the pastorate of the First-Central Congregational Church of Omaha in the summer of 1976. Ill health forced his resignation in July of this year.

He is survived by his wife, Miriam; their daughter, Mirelle, a student at Grinnell College; his mother; a sister; and two brothers.
