Mrs. Vivian Hollingsworth Davis, 89, of 388 Elder Road in Griffin, Ga., died Monday, March 6, 1989, at AMI Griffin-Spalding Hospital.

Mrs. Davis was born February 21, 1900, in Boone. Her parents were William and Elizabeth Warnack Hollingsworth. After the death of her mother, she lived with her grandparents, George and Frances Hollingsworth and attended Deep River School.

She was a 1923 graduate of Coe College in Cedar Rapids. Mrs. Davis did graduate work at the University of Florida. She had lived in Fort Pierce, Fla., for 57 years. She taught in the St. Lucie County School system and was also an artist.

Mrs. Davis is the adopted grandmother of Mr. and Mrs. Harold C. Smith, Jr., of Griffin with whom she had made her home since 1981. For 60 years, she was a member of the Ruth Chapter No. 7, Order of the Eastern Star. She was a life member of the Fort Pierce Art Club. Mrs. Davis was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary. She was an Elder and a Deacon of the First Presbyterian Church of Fort Pierce for many years. Mrs. Davis was the Teacher of the Bledsoe Bible Class of the First Presbyterian Church of Griffin. She was a member of the Past Matrons and Patrons Club, the American Association of University Women, the Florida Historical Society and the Florida Education Association.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Virginia Kelso of Miami, Fla., two grandsons, three granddaughters, Lynn Little of What Cheer, Sandra Huffman of New Sharon and Karen Robinson of Oskaloosa, and seven great-grandchildren. She is also survived by her adopted family, Harold and Sara Smith, and Melanie and Randy Smith, all of Griffin.

Preceding her in death were her husband, Clifton Davis, and a daughter, Mrs. Patricia Robinson.

Memorial services were held Thursday, March 9, 1989, at 3 p.m., at First Presbyterian church in Griffin with Rev. Spencer Fry officiating.

The body was cremated.

Interment will be at the Goldenrod Cemetery, Deep River, at a later date.
