Funeral services were held May 31 at 10 a.m. at St. Bridget's Catholic church in Victor for Mrs. Julia DeVilder. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward C. Geer said the requiem mass. A rosary service was held the previous evening at McAninch chapel.

Sept. 12, 1922, she was married to Arthur DeVilder. The couple had one daughter, Mrs. Karl (Arlene) Heitman. The family lived at Kewanee, Ill., and Victor before moving to a farm north of Brooklyn, which was their home for 27 years. After her husband's death in 1959, Mrs. DeVilder made her home in Victor.

May 26 Mrs. DeVilder entered a Grinnell hospital for medical attention. She died suddenly May 28 at the age of 66.

Surviving are her daughter, Mrs. Heitman, and three grandchildren, Ronald, Richard and Rhonda Heitman; a sister, Mrs. Charles (Emma) Van Hoeck of Watkins; two brothers, Edward Blomme of Brooklyn and Emiel Blomme of Belle Plaine.
