Keith Greer Dempster, 92, of Des Moines, formerly of Grinnell, died Wednesday, Jan. 31, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

He was a district representative for Fun Hybrids and was employed by the Maytag Company in Newton for 18 years. He sold his farm in 1989 and moved to Des Moines to retire.

Surviving are his children, Keith of Iowa City and Rita Dempster of Des Moines; one brother, J. Gaylord of Sun City, Ariz.; and a grand-daughter. He was preceded in death by his parents and his wife.
