

## Last Rites Said <sup>8/6/71</sup> For Glenn Depew

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 10, at the St. John's Lutheran Church in rural Tama for Glenn William Depew, 58, of 414 W. South St., in Marshalltown who died Friday evening at Marshalltown Community Hospital. His death was attributed to cancer.

Mr. Depew was a well-known Gilman-area farmer.

The Rev. Norris P. Hansor, pastor of the church, officiated at the services. Burial was in Maple Grove Cemetery in rural Tama.

The son of Berton A. and Anna Schmidt Depew, Mr. Depew was born in Columbia Township in Tama County on Aug. 5, 1913. He received his education in the Laudedale school in rural Tama.

When he was age 6, his mother died and he moved to the home of his aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Schmidt of the Sheridan Community, where he grew to manhood.

On July 14, 1938, Mr. Depew married Marie Grace Hand of Tama and the couple made their home on various farms where Mr. Depew was employed. In 1943 the couple moved to a farm southeast of Laurel where they resided for ten years. Mr. Depew then purchased a farm on Rte. 2, Gilman, where the couple lived until July 3, 1971, when they purchased a home in Marshalltown.

Mr. Depew was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church in rural Tama.

Survivors include his wife, Marie; five children — Glenn Junior Depew and Mrs. Aaron (Linda) Cowan of Marshalltown, Mrs. Kenneth (Jean) Woodworth of Evansdale, Mrs. Roger (Sandra) Balmer of Gilman and Miss Vicki Depew at the family home; 11 grandchildren; a brother, Marvin Depew of Council Bluffs; three sisters — Mrs. Fred (Edna) Ferneau and Mrs. Darrell (Marie) Shadden of Tama and Mrs. Warren (Hazel) Tomlinson of Gilman; and several nieces and nephews.

Mr. Depew was preceded in death by his mother in 1919 and his father in 1960.
