Wadie Deppe, 93, of Kellogg died Thursday, June 21, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John Epperson of the Grinnell Christian Church officiating. Organist was Ann Buchmeier, and vocalist was Naomi Anderson.

Mrs. Deppe was a member of the Neighborly Neighbor Club and the Kellogg Historical Society and was a former member of the Glendale Grange. She had lived at Friendship Manor for the past few months.

Surviving are two sons, Lorne W. and Maynard, both of Kellogg; a daughter, Viola E. Paulson of Grinnell; six grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and five great-great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband; one brother, C.G. Littrell; and three sisters, Viola Hartzell, Nola Littrell and one in infancy.
