Rites held for Mrs. Dhooge

Mary Anne Dhooge, 70, of Rte. 1, Brooklyn, died at her home Wednesday, July 1.

The Funeral Mass was celebrated at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, July 4, at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, with the Rev. Karl Holtkamp officiating. Organist was Marilyn Kriegel.
