Conduct Brooklyn Funeral Services For Hugh Dillon

Funeral services for Hugh Dillon, 70, of rural Brooklyn, who died Jan. 24, were held Thursday afternoon, Jan. 26, from the Brooklyn Presbyterian church with the Rev. Leslie Rogers of the Church of the Brethren officiating, assisted by the Rev. George Roquet.

Organ music was provided by Mrs. Ed Bartachek. Pallbearers were Charles Dillon, Fred Dillon, Arlo Miller, Darrell Heishman, Howard Gritsch and Calvin Barnes.

The son of Leon and Emma Funk Dillon, he was born Dec. 16, 1896, in Pike county at Petersburg, Ind. During World War I he enlisted in the service in Montana and served in the infantry, seeing active duty in France and Belgium.

On June 23, 1951, he was united in marriage with Evalena Heishman Fraker.

He was a member of the Church of the Brethren at Brooklyn.

Survivors include his widow, Evalena; one brother, George Dillon of Malcom; a half brother, Lloyd Dillon of Velpen, Ind.; a half sister, Beulah Hockmeister of Louisville, Ky.; and several nieces and nephews.
