

Lelah Dillon services set ^{H-R} February 23, 1976

Lelah Grace Dillon, 80, of Rte. 2, Grinnell, died suddenly Friday evening at Grinnell General Hospital. Feb. 20

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Hugh A. Shiveley, pastor of the First Baptist Church, officiating. Organist will be Mrs. Willard Heffner. Pallbearers will be Carl Dillon, Fred Dillon, Dennis Gritsch, Donald Gregory, Dale Emmert, and Mike Emmert. Burial will be at Ivy Hill Cemetery, Malcom.

The daughter of Charlie and Dora Green Wineinger, she was born March 6, 1895, in DuBois County, Ind. She attended rural school near her home and was graduated from Ireland, Ind., High School. She attended Oakland City College in Indiana.

On March 2, 1917, she was married to George Dillon in

Jasper, Ind. The couple had four children. Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Dillon lived in Indiana, coming to Iowa in 1924. They farmed near Hartwick and Brooklyn and moved to a farm near Malcom in 1939. In 1972, they moved to their home west of Grinnell.

Mrs. Dillon is survived by her husband, George; three children, Mrs. Dora Gritsch of Brooklyn, Charles L. Dillon of Rte. 1, Malcom, and Mrs. Calvin (Opal) Barns of Grinnell; five grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandson.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her son, Robert L. Dillon, who was killed in action during the Korean conflict; one grandson, Mark Barns; three brothers, Earl, Dennis and Ernest Wineinger; and one sister, Teresa, who died in infancy.
