Funeral services will be conducted Tuesday at 1 p.m. at the James funeral home for Carl Dodson, 70, who died at his home in Grinnell Friday eve-ning. The Rev. C. E. Kingsley of the Baptist church will officiate. Burial will be in the Oddfellows cemetery at Indianola.

He was born March 1, 1886 at Monmouth, Ill. He had lived in Grinnell for the past 16 years and was a feed salesman for the Life Guard Feed Products company.

He was a member of the Masonic lodge of New Virginia. Surviving are his wife Clistic: three daughters, Mrs. Gilbert (Nadine) Hobbe of Chariton, Mrs. J. A. Chief Pharmacist's Mate Merrill Dodson will be unable to get home for the funeral services for his father, Carl Dodson. He is serving on the USS Storms, a destroyer now in Cuban waters.
