Susanna Donnan was born April 24, 1862, and departed this life Jan. 9, 1923, aged 60 years, 8 months and 15 days.

She was born in Rock Island county, Ilinlois, and moved with her parents to Poweshiek county, Iowa, March 4, 1870, settling on the farm west of Ewart where she has lived ever since.
