Tama Herald: James Seymour Doran was born in Bureau county, Ill., July 17, 1871, and died at his home in Toledo Thursday, Dec. 4, 1919, at the age of 48 years, 4 months and 17 days. When a small child with his parents and older brother and two sisters he came to Iowa, the family settling on a farm near Malcom.
