On Dec. 2, 1919, she was married to Herbert L. Doty at Buffalo, N.Y. The couple lived in Binghamton, N.Y., for many years, where Mr. Doty was director of art for the Binghamton public school system.

Mrs. Doty came to Grinnell and the Mayflower Home in 1974. She was a member of the Mayflower Home Chorus and had founded the Grinnell Senior Citizens Kitchen Band. She was a member of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, at Binghamton and had continued her membership here.
