

DIED LAST SUNDAY MORNING.
Montezuma Rep.
Mrs. Charles Douglass Passed Away
At Cedar Rapids After
Long Illness.

Mrs. Chas. Douglass died at Cedar Rapids Sunday after an illness which extended over many months. The remains, accompanied by the sorrowing family, were brought to this city on Monday.

The funeral service will be held from the M. E. church at 1 o'clock this (Wednesday) afternoon, Rev. O. S. Baker officiating.

Mrs. Ellen P. Douglass was born at Lynnvile, Iowa, Dec. 6, 1870, and died at Cedar Rapids, Iowa February 2, 1908 aged 37 years, 1 month and 26 days.

She was united in marriage to Chas. J. Douglass in this city January 20, 1889. Here they resided nearly 20 years. Three years ago they removed to Cedar Rapids.

To Mr. and Mrs. Douglass were born four children; Mrs. Ethel Whisler of Desmit, S. D., Nina E., Robt. D. and Davis W. Douglass, yet at home.

Besides the husband and children there remain to mourn a father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Wilson who live five miles west of town, also three brothers and five sisters.

During their residence here in Montezuma, Mrs. Douglass was a member of the Methodist Protestant church with which she united in her girlhood days. She was a devoted wife and mother, and a consistent christian. She suffered long and much, being confined to her bed the last fifteen months. Death was but the opening of Heaven's gate through which she passed to her eternal reward.
