CAME FIRST TO GRINNELL IN THE SPRING OF 1869

Lived on a Farm Southwest of Town For Many Years; Also on a Farm Near Malcom

Mrs. Margaret Catharine Downing passed away Wednesday, April 7 at 7:00 P. M. at the home of her son Charles at Modesto, Calif., after several days of acute illness. Funeral services were conducted at 11:00 A. M. Monday, April 11, by the Rev. C. B.
