Funeral services for W. H. Duffus of Battle Creek, Mich., were held this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the local Methodist church conducted by Rev. W. J. Todd of Corydon and Rev. Chas. R. Rowe. Interment was in the Malcom cemetery.

Mr. Duffus passed away Tuesday morning following an illness of several months' duration. The Duffuses formerly lived in Grinnell but Battle Creek had been their home for the past 11 years.

Out of town relatives attending the funeral were his widow, Mrs. W. H. Duffus, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Duffus, Mr. and Mrs. Matt Binegar and two daughters, Jean and Doris, Mrs. Sadie Zandenberg, all of Battle Creek; and Claire Duffus of Eldora.

William Duffus, son of Alexander and Elizabeth Duffus, was born near Montezuma, Iowa, April 17, 1858, and died at his home in Eattle Creek, Mich., Tuesday morning, Sept. 15, 1936.

In the spring of 1873 his father's family moved to the old home place south of Malcom. Here Wilsam helped with the farming until his marriage March 5, 1884, to Miss Elizabeth Wheeler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Wheeler.
