Glenn Dunwoody Dies In Knoxville

Glenn A. Dunwoody, 51, died suddenly Friday afternoon (Aug. 23) at Knoxville, Iowa.

The son of Dewey D. and Olive Adeline Bucknam Dunwoody, Mr. Dunwoody was born at New Sharon, Iowa, on Nov. 2, 1916. He attended the schools of New Sharon and enlisted in the Army during World War II. Following his discharge, he lived in the New Sharon and Knoxville, Iowa communities.

Survivors include two sisters—Mrs. Ralph (Fae) Allen of Grinnell, and Irene Elaine of Long Beach, Calif.

Mr. Dunwoody was preceded in death by his father, his mother—in November of 1967, and a brother and a sister—Leroy Dunwoody and Nina Fern Dunwoody.

Mr. Dunwoody was a member of the Knoxville American Legion and attended the Methodist Sunday school at New Sharon in his youth. Later he attended the Assembly of God church.

Funeral services for Glen A. Dunwoody were held at 2 p.m. Monday (Aug. 26) at the Smith Funeral Home in Grinnell, with the Rev. Donald E. Skiles, pastor of the Calvary Assembly of God church in Carthage, Ill., officiating.

Organist was Mrs. James Wilson and vocalist was Darrell Wyss.

Pallbearers were Gerald Bond, Harry Bond, William Belcher, Herschel Smith, Louis A. Smith and Forrest G. Williams. Flowerbearers were Mrs. Donald King and Mrs. William Belcher.
