

Edward Durr Rites Tuesday ^{5/14/72}

Edward Durr, 82, of Rte. 2, Grinnell, died early Sunday (May 14) at Grinnell General Hospital, following a week of hospitalization due to a heart condition.

The son of George and Margaret Blank Durr, he was born in Rock Creek Township, Jasper County, Dec. 7, 1889. He attended the rural schools near his home and later farmed in the Rock Creek Lake community.

He was married to Mary Jane Peak Feb. 24, 1926, at Albia. The couple had three children—Mrs. Dean (Margaret) Clark of Grinnell, Lloyd Durr of Rte. 2, Grinnell; and Donald Durr of Ankeny.

Mr. Durr had spent all of his life in Rock Creek Township farming, and in 1953 he and his wife moved to their present home.

Mr. Durr is survived by his wife Mary Jane, his three
