FUNERAL WAS HELD IN
EWART THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Mrs. Easter And Husband Were Char-
ter Members of Grinnell Church
Of Christ.

Iva Grant Easter was born on a farm two miles south of Ewart, Iowa, on April 22, 1872. She was the youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Grant. She attended the public schools and grew to womanhood in the Ewart vicinity. On July 11, 1894 she was united in marriage to E. A. Easter also of that vicinity. The first nine years of their married life were spent on a farm near Ewart. In 1903 they moved to Grinnell where Mr. Easter was actively engaged in business for several years. On March 1, 1926 they moved to Brooklyn where they have since resided.

Mrs. Easter was well and favorably known and will be missed by a host of friends. She was a devoted wife and took an active and lively interest in church and community enterprises.

She and her husband were charter members of the Church of Christ in Grinnell, and she lived in that faith until death which occurred at her home in Brooklyn, September 27, 1927, after an illness lasting a year. She was also an active member of the order of Pythians, the Rebekahs, the W. R. C. and the Eastern Star.

She is survived by her husband, Mr. E. A. Easter, one sister, Mrs. Jennie Clark of Grinnell, two brothers Thomas and William, both of Grinnell, and a niece, Ruth Bryan who has made her home with the Easters for the past ten years.

Funeral services were conducted Thursday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the Ewart church. Rev. E. W. Gregson of Montezuma was in charge. Short services were conducted from the home in Brooklyn at 12:30 o'clock.
