Clarence Ebert services held

Clarence L. Ebert, 58, of Newton, died Friday, May 31, en route to Skiff Memorial Hospital in Newton.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at the Reese Chapel in Newton, with burial in Newton Union Cemetery.

A memorial in Mr. Ebert's name has been established with the American Cancer Society.

The son of Herman and Lula Bollhoefer Ebert, he was born March 2, 1927, in Newton. A

lifelong resident of the Kellogg and Newton areas, he moved to Newton in 1967. He served with the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict and was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 1655 in Newton. He had farmed and worked for McMaster Deep Rock and Morris Oil Co. in Kellogg.

Survivors include a brother, Dale Ebert of Rte. 2, Kellogg, and one sister, Avis Boat of Crawfordsville, Ind.
