Pres. Nollen's daughter dies

Emeline Nollen Edwards, daughter of John Nollen, former president of Grinnell College, died of cancer Sunday in San Francisco. She was 65 years old. 3-23-76

A native of Lake Forest, Ill., where her father was president of Lake Forest University, Mrs. Edwards attended private schools in Chicago and in Rome and Paris when her father headed the YMCA in Italy.

When her father was appointed president of Grinnell College, Mrs. Edwards entered Grinnell College as a sophomore. She completed her education at Stanford University, graduating with high distinction in 1931 and a degree in philosophy. She attended the Stanford Graduate School of Business.

Mrs. Edwards first worked for the I. Magnin Company and then did investment research for the Crocker First National Bank and Dodge and Cox, all located in San Francisco.

In 1936, she joined the editorial research staff of Time Inc.'s Fortune magazine in New York. She shifted to the business section of Time, became head business researcher and rose to associate editor. In 1944, she was named assistant to the then general manager of Life Magazine Andrew Heiskell, the present chairman of Time Inc.

She left Time Inc. in 1947 to marry Parker Edwards, the illustrator, and subsequently was employed as assistant to Beardsley Ruml, the economist. The marriage ended in divorce.

Mrs. Edwards rejoined Time Inc. in 1957 as special assistant to Henry R. Luce, who was then editor-in-chief of all Time Inc. publications. She remained with Luce until he died in 1967.

Mrs. Edwards had lived in San Francisco since her retirement from Time Inc. in 1967.

Surviving Mrs. Edwards is a daughter, Ann Ferguson Edwards of New York City.
