Mr. Edwards business affairs included a membership on the board of directors of Grocery Wholesale, Inc., from 1944 to 1950, an organization which he had served as secretary and treasurer. He was also an active bowler.

Survivors include his wife, the former Margaret J. Fowler, whom he married on Sept. 8, 1937, near Bristol, Wis., and two sisters. Hazel and Marie Edwards, associated with him in the store operation.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a daughter, Barbara R. Edwards, in 1979; a son, Howard Edwards Jr., who died in infancy; a sister, Ruth Edwards; two half brothers, Ernest L. Edwards and Chester Edwards; and a half sister, Ethel Bowman.
