Russell Evans dies in Oregon

Funeral services for Russell Paul Evans, 66, of Myrtle Point, Ore., formerly of Grinnell, were conducted Friday, Sept. 14, at Myrtle Point Chapel, with the Rev. Kenneth Stevens of the Church of God in Powers officiating. Mr. Evans died Sept. 1 in Camas Valley. Burial was at Myrtle Crest memorial Gardens, Coquille, Ore.

Mr. Evans was a retired dairyman and businessman and had lived in Myrtle Point for 31 years. He was an active member of the Grange for many years. He was master of the Coos County Pomona Grange for several years, state deputy for the Oregon State Grange for four years, and a member of the national Grange. He was also a member of the Royal Neighbors of Myrtle Point for 25 years and a

former member of the Coos County Planning Commission.

He was the son of William A. and Pearl Splanger Evans and was born Sept. 16, 1915, in Grinnell.
