Sarah Hall was born in Jefferson county, lowa, June 7, 1845. At the age of one year she moved with her parents to Poweshiek county, where she grew to womanhood and was united in marriage with John T. Faircloth, March 8, 1866. This union was blessed with one child, Nannie L., born Oct. 29, 1871, who departed this life February 4, 1874. Mrs. Faircloth lived the greater part of her married lite in Grinnell and vicinity.

Twenty-nine years ago she was converted and immersed by Rev. Martin Gregson and became a member of the Baptist church.
