Military Burial Honors A. G. Fett, 74

The funeral of a prominent Montezuman, A. G. Fett, was held Saturday afternoon from the Presbyterian Church with the Rev. G. R. Dieken officiating at the service. Mrs. Lewis Lundy was soloist at the service accompanied by organist, Miss Dorothy Dickson.

Mr. Fett was buried in the Masonic-IOOF Cemetery with the military commital service conducted by the Blakley-Stevens American Legion Post. Serving as pallbearers were Leland Fett, Harold Siders, Lawrence Fett, Leroy Fett, Bernard Shellhase and Lowell Shellhase.

Mr. Fett died Thursday, June 24, at Veteran's Hospital in Iowa City after an extended illness. He was 74. Arnold George, son of Frederick and Wilhemina Fett, was born at Van Horne, Iowa, October 13, 1890. He was one of a family of 16 children and attended the local school.

In 1917 he enlisted in the

army and served in the 26th Infantry Regiment, Co. C, 1st Div. as First Sergeant. Following the Armistice, he served in the Occupation Army in Germany and was honorably discharged in 1919.

On Feb. 23, 1921 he married Nina Fitzsimmons and they resided in Montezuma since that time.

He was a member of the Blakley-Stevens Post of the American Legion, Community Barracks, Masonic Lodge and the Presbyterian Church. He served as Service Officer of the Blakley-Stevens Post since 1919 and was awarded a life membership in the American Legion in March, 1965. He had been custodian of the Memorial Hall for the last several years and was admired by children and young people for his supervision.

Besides his wife, Nina, he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Marie Nenabers and Mrs. Anna Siders, and four brothers, Herman, Art, Fred and Will.
