

## Lucille Fiser 130 April 25, 2001

Lucille Fiser, age 79 of Ladora, died Sunday, Apr. 15, 2001, at her home.

Funeral services were held at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Apr. 18 at Smith Funeral Home in Victor. The Rev. Audrey Westendorf of the Ladora Methodist Church officiated. Music was provided by organist Marilyn Rodgers and soloists Lynn Stauffer and Daryl Fiser. Selections were "Amazing Grace," "How Great Thou Art," and "The Lord's Prayer."
