Grinnell man dies

as fire sweeps through bedroom

A Grinnell man died Friday night when flames swept through the bedroom and attic of his two-story frame home at 408 Broad St.

John J. Fleming, 60, was pronounced dead by Poweshiek County Medical Examiner Dr. Robert Carney. No autopsy was planned, Čarney said.

Authorities said Fleming was alone in the house at the time of the blaze. It was not immediately clear whether he had died prior to the time flames broke out or if death was the result of the fire itself. The body was badly burned.

Firemen responded to the eall at about 11 p.m.

"Flames were pouring out of the windows when we got there," fireman Giles Jay said. "But the place didn't burn to the ground. Most of the damage was concentrated around the bedroom and at-

It was not until after 1:30 a.m. Saturday that firemen were able to return to the station.

Investigators from the office of the state fire marshal were due in Grinnell Saturday to probe the cause of the blaze.

Funeral services for John Fleming will be held at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at St. Mary's Catholic Church. The Scripture Service will be at 7:30 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home. Graveside services will be conducted by members of the Grinnell Veterans Ceremonial Unit, with burial at Hazelwood Cemetery Should friends desire, memorials in Mr. Fleming's name may be left at the Smith Funeral Home.

attended school here and later was inducted into the U.S. Army and served during World War II.
