

Mrs Fogelson rites Friday

Penelope (Penny) Fogelson, 35, of Des Moines, the daughter of Mrs. Elsie Palmer of 1427 Prince St., Grinnell, died Tuesday evening at Des Moines.

Death was attributed to a heart condition she had suffered for the past two years.

Funeral services are scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Damon R. Reese, pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church, officiating. Burial will be at Rock Creek Cemetery in Jasper County.
