Cancer Claims Life of Charlie Forret, Benefactor of Birds at Holiday Lake

Funeral services were held at the Fisher Funeral Home, Adel, Sunday for Charlie A. Forret, 65, who died Thursday in Des Moines General hospital.

Forret, a resident of Holiday Lake, had been ill with

cancer 1-1/2 years.
