The pall-bearers were Will Gardner, Hubert Jacobs. W. J. Neely, Austin Legg, Emery Stickle and Harry James. Many floral tributes from the neighbors around Newburg testified to their esteem and sincere sorrow. Interment was in Haziewood.

This is the first death in either family. The mourners have the sincere sympathy of a wide circle of friends.
