Mrs. Frankforth passed away March 16, 1938. Mr. Frankforth then returned to Iowa and made his home with his daughter Mrs. R. L. Tone and family for 41/2 years. On June 24, 1943 he was married to Miss Laura McGrew. They made their home in Gilman until the time of his death.
