Funeral of W. S. Freeman Held Friday

William Samuel Freeman, was born on a farm 5 miles N. West of Grinnell, March 9, 1874, and grew to manhood in this vicinity, moving with his parents Mr. and Mrs. P. E. Freeman to near Murry, Clark Co., Iowa, and after remaining there 5 years moved to Davis Co. Iowa, living in and around Bloomfield a number of years.

After leaving Bloomfield 8 or 10 years ago, he spent much of his time in the West. Returning to Grinnell last summer and being in poor health he was in the Community hospital several weeks for treatments.

Going to Washington, D. C., last fall, he passed away at that place from heart-trouble February 23, 1925, being 51 years 11 months and 14 days old at the time of death. He leaves to mourn the loss, his aged mother Mrs. Nancy A. Freeman, one sister, Mrs. Fred Elmore of Grinnell and one brother Merlin A. Freeman of Ottumwa, Iowa.
