

### Obituary-Fryer

W. Otis Fryer was born on the on the farm one mile north of Ravenwood, now occupied by C. H. Spoonemore, on August 10, 1877, and died at his home near Hillsdale, Wyo., Friday, February 17, 1933, aged 55 years, 6 months and 7 days. He was united in marriage to Della Smith on January 14, 1902. The greater part of his life was spent on a farm near Ravenwood until he, with seven of his friends, entered homestead claims near Hillsdale where he has resided the past twenty-five years.

He was a dutiful son, a kind brother, and a devoted, thoughtful companion. In his passing he will be missed by all.

He is survived by his wife, his father, J. C. Fryer, two brothers, Leland and Harry Fryer of Ravenwood, three sisters, Mrs. Ward Bennett and Miss Blanche Fryer, Ravenwood, and Mrs. James Sawyer of Maryville, and many other relatives, besides numerous friends in Wyoming and Missouri who mourn his passing away. His mother preceded him to the other world about two years ago. He was here and helped care for her to the end.

Funeral services were held Sunday, February 12, at 2 o'clock at the Methodist church in Hillsdale, and Monday his brothers, Leland and Harry and his sister, Mrs. Ward Bennett, accompanied by Mrs. Fryer, Mrs. Charles McGill of Burns, Wyo., and Geo. Lavalleur of Hillsdale, with the remains left there for Ravenwood, arriving here at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning. The body lay in state at the home of his father until Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock

when funeral services were conducted from the Methodist church by the pastor, Rev. J. M. Monroe.

A quartette composed of Mrs. M. L. Bentley, Mrs. H. J. Beedle, W. A. Conn and Z. A. Warden, with Miss Gertrude Horton at the piano, sang "Home of Soul," "Land On High" and "God Be With You."
