

Harold Fuller Rites Held Monday

Funeral services for Harold Fuller were conducted by Mr. Dean Lankford Monday, August 7, at the Steffy Funeral Home. Music was provided by Mr. Lankford, accompanied by Miss Alice Underwood, organist.

Interment was in Jackson Township Cemetery at Montezuma. Members of Blakley-Stevens Post of the American Legion served as casket bearers, color guard and firing squad for the military rites at the cemetery.

Mr. Fuller, 52, died at University Hospital, Iowa City, on Thursday, August 3, after he became ill the previous day while employed at a construction job near Center Point, Iowa.

Harold, son of Hannah and Fred Fuller, was born near Tracy, Minn., on Jan. 22, 1915, where he attended the local school. His father died when he was quite young and he took over the farm work.

He served with the 64th Armored Infantry Battalion in World War II and participated in several major battles in the European campaign. He

received the Purple Heart and the Bronze Service Arrowhead.

He was united in marriage with Gladys Anderson. To this union two sons were born. They farmed for several years in Minnesota and later Harold worked for a lumber mill in Montana.

On Aug. 22, 1954, he was united in marriage with Violet Williams Lewis. They made their home on a farm near Grand River, Iowa.

Harold was interested in construction work and was employed by the L. L. Pelling Construction Co. Harold and his wife, Violet, own the Party House restaurant in Montezuma.

He is survived by his wife; two sons, Glenn, in service in Vietnam, and Fred of El Monte, Calif.; three stepchildren, Wanda Van Cott of Las Vegas, Nev., Sally Owens of Phoenix, Ariz., and Keith Williams of Montezuma; five grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Clarence Cote of Tracy, Minn., and Mrs. Frank Warren of El Monte, Calif.
