Funeral Services Here Friday For Francis Garrigan

Francis Charles Garrigan, 46, of Des Moines, formerly of Grinnell, died Wednesday morning at a Des Moines hospital where he had been a patient since the previous Saturday.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Leo V. Kuebrich, pastor of St. Mary's Catholic church, officiating. Organ music will be provided by Mrs. L. W. Brock.

Pallbearers will be Melvin Adams, George Appleby, Robert Weiser, Clifford Johnson, Laverne Reavis and George Smith Jr. Burial will be in Calvary section of Hazelwood cemetery.

American Legion graveside rites will be conducted by Jack Day, chaplain, and members of the Focht-Tennant Post No. 53 ceremonial unit, with W. K. Richardson, commander.

He was born on Feb. 1st, 1920, at Grinnell, the son of Charles John and Rose Katherine Ourada Garrigan, one of a family of three children. He graduated from Grinnell high school and served as a crewmember on a bomber with the Army Air Corps during World War II.

Following his discharge from the service he had been employed as a cement mason and ornamental plasterer. He had traveled extensively and had made his home in Rock Island, Ill., and since last April in Des Moines.

Surviving are his father, Charles J. Garrigan of Grinnell; and his two sisters, Kathleen E. Garrigan of Omaha, Neb., and Mrs. Myron (Jean) White of Rte. 1, Grinnell.

He was preceded in death by his mother on Jan. 16th, 1952.
