Earl Garver Passes Away 7 / 2 This Morning

Earl Garver, 21 years old, who has been lying in a serious condition following a stroke of paralysis for a little over a week, passed away at 6:30 o'clock this morning at a local hospital where he had been since being brought back from the hospital at Iowa City last Friday.

The close of this promising life, at the very threshold of useful manhood, will occasion deep sorrow among a wide circle of friends. Earl was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Garver and was born Jan. 1, 1912. He had lived in Grinnell all his life. He attended the Grinnell schools and graduated from high school in 1930. During his high school days he played on the football team and was a star in basketball. He attended Grinnell college one year and since then has been working at the glove factory.

Although he had always been a delicate boy, Earl refused to give up his interest in athletics. He played on the Glovers' championship kittenball team and also started this season as a member of the Grinnell Boosters' baseball club, but the illness which finally caused his death came upon him and forced his retirement early in the summer. Since then he had grown steadily worse until he suffered the stroke which finally caused his death.

He is survived by his parents, two brothers, Lyle and Edward, and one sister, Mrs. C. M. Kaisand.

Funeral arrangements have not been made.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Baptist church, conducted by Rev. William Welsh.
