**Marvin Dale Gass
Succumbs To
Heart Condition**

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Steffy Funeral Home for Marvin Gass, conducted by the Rev. G. R. Dieken. Alice Underwood played the musical selections and accompanied Keith Stahl as he sang "In the Garden."

Marvin Dale, son of Paul Andrew and Cecelia Todd Gass, was born Mar. 20, 1927, at Brooklyn and died at the University hospital, Iowa City, Mar. 23, at 36 years of age. He had been in ill health for several years, due to a heart condition resulting from rheumatic fever in early childhood.

Marvin attended high school in Montezuma.

On July 16, 1944, he was united in marriage with Mildred Smith, at Troy, Kans. To this union, four children were born, Linda Lee, Betty Jean, Karen Kaye and Marvin Dale II.

Most of his life was spent in the trucking business around Montezuma, with the exception of five years when the family lived in Pasco, Wash.
