Three years ago she gave up her home at the solicitation of her children and has spent the time among them since. Her interest in life and her remarkable activity have made her an outstanding figure and a constant marvel to her many friends.

She leaves besides her children, four grandchildren, Mrs. Muriel Gates Curfman of Ladora, Harry S. Gates of Saskatchewan, Canada, Howard and Paul Seeley of Rockwell City and Winifred Gates Patterson, who passed to the great beyond five years ago. Beside these are three great-grandchildren, Harriett Ruth Gates, Virginia and Ramon Patterson.
