

Funeral Services For Albert Gause

Funeral services for Albert Gause were held Monday afternoon at 2:30 at the residence with L. W. Reynolds in charge. Burial was in the Woodland Cemetery. Death was due to complications, which were caused by a stroke of paralysis suffered four years ago, which had left Mr. Gause an invalid.

Music was furnished by Mrs. Frank Ratliff, Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Gifford and Rev. Mr. Reynolds. Pallbearers were six nephews, Harry Williams, Arno Latham, L. T. Gause, Lester Gause, Elmer Gause and Clifford Gause.

Albert Gause was the son of Eli and Martha Gause. He was born June 16, 1853 at Spiceland, Ind., and at three years of age moved with his parents to Lynnville where they made their home until 1861 when they returned to Indiana. The family resided in the state of Indiana for fourteen years and then moved back to Iowa.

Mr. Gause was united in marriage to Miss Charity Morrell of Kellogg on Sept. 30, 1880. To this union four children were born: Harvey of Lynnville, Mrs. Edna Vander Syde of Hollandale, Minn., Mrs. Bessie Berry of Phillip, S. D. and Ethel who died in infancy.

He was a member of the Christian Church while making his home in Clemons, Ia., but attended the Friends Church during his residence in Lynnville.

Mr. Gause is survived by his wife, three children and four brothers: Oliver Gause of Lynnville, Samuel Gause of Washouglia, Wash., Isaac Gause of Westfield, Ind., and Seth Gause of Clemons, Ia.
